Meeting God at the Boundaries Author: Lucia Ann McSpadden

The Scriptures lead us again and again to understand that God meets us at these boundaries, where "how we do things" and "how we understand ourselves" are brought into sharp relief. Realizing that God's vision infinitely surpasses ours, Christians are challenged to look beyond the boundary and with courage and faith to change the very nature of the boundaries. For, in truth human boundaries are not sharp, thin lines but rather relational spaces and patterned places where difference and commonalities are negotiated.

This book is the result of three year study commissioned by the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry of the United Methodist Church. The aim of the project was to gather and analyze the experience of leaders and congregations in existing cross-cultural-cross racial appointments in the denomination.
